After they are blessed, they will be packed up and sent to various organizations like Habitat for Humanity, The Ronald McDonald House in Toledo and Lutheran World Relief. LWR's guilt ministry is their longest running program with the distribution of their first guilts in 1945 to families in Europe at the end of WWII. An average of 300,000 quilts year are given away to those in need worldwide.
